Fee schedule

The Package Fee for students and adults provides lodging, food, equipment and shared instruction. Typical arrivals are at 11 am and include lunch. Typical departures are at 1:00pm with a lunch or a travel meal. Weekend stays have a 4pm arrival in time for dinner.

For our school groups, one lead teacher is free and all other school staff that work at the school are at 50%. Chaperones pay full price. Groups not associated with a school, such as Girl Scouts, will not be charged for the group leader, but all other adults will pay full price. Groups that do not follow our typical stay pattern, such as staying one night only, pay full price for all adults.

Special circumstance students or adults from the visiting group who spend a day with us are charged a flat fee of \$45 per day regardless of the amount of participation in activities or meals.

We will no longer bill at a reduced rate for partial stays. As an example, a student attending 4 days of a five-day program is responsible for the full five-day fee. The one exception is chaperone or teacher swap outs. As an example, if during a five-day stay one chaperone is present for Monday-Wednesday lunch and a different chaperone steps in for Wednesday afternoon-Friday, Wolf Ridge will charge one 5-day fee.

Teachers who have attended Wolf Ridge for at least ten years and are retired may attend as a chaperone for free. No more than two per school.

Credit Card Processing

All credit card payments for groups, schools, conferences, and businesses will be charged a 3% processing fee. Groups choosing to pay by cash or check will not be subject to this fee.

This 3% should be accounted for when submitting purchase orders to schools, businesses, and foundations. For example, if a group total is \$100 dollars they would need to submit a purchase order in the amount of \$103.

Drop in Visitor Policy

All visitors to the Wolf Ridge Campus must stop by the office to sign a liability form. Wolf Ridge will inform the group or school representative that a visitor is in the office and receive permission to release the visitor. Meals may be purchased with prior notice. There is no fee attached to a drop-in visitor who does not eat a meal.

Minnesota Educational Tax Credit

Wolf Ridge's understanding is that MN tax laws allow deductions to be taken by families whose children participate in educational enrichment programs outside of school. Only the cost of instruction qualifies for credit / deduction. Room, board and transportation do not qualify. Funds that have been raised by the student do not qualify for credit or deduction. A dollar for dollar credit can be given for families with a low income as designated by the state. For families with incomes above the designated level, they may take an itemized deduction.
