


# Why Take a Wolf Ridge Master Naturalist Course?

#### Lodging at Wolf Ridge

Wolf Ridge is excited to offer Master Naturalist students the opportunity to stay on campus during your biome course. Take the stress away of trying to find lodging on the North Shore for a week and stay in the Wolf Ridge MAC Lodge. The MAC Lodge is Living Building Challenge Certified and is the first remodeled building in the world to receive the certification. With the lodge being within walking distance of the Dining Hall and classroom buildings, you will get to focus on a total week of nature immersion. A Sunday evening arrival will allow an early start Monday morning and a Saturday morning check out accommodates the Friday evening graduation celebration.

Some features of staying at the MAC Lodge include:
